#### Strike action:

The next scheduled Teacher's strike dates are due on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> March and Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March. As far as we are aware, the indications are that the only year group affected is Year 5. Year 5 will be closed on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> March, however it will be open on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March. All parents should be aware that members of the NEU are entitled to make their decision to strike on the actual day. Therefore, there is still a potential possibility of class closures with very little notice

We would urge all parents to have contingency plans in place in the unlikely event of this occurring. Any lastminute closure of classes will be notified via text message through teachers2parents.

We are sorry that you may have to make alternative arrangements for your child at short notice, and/or that they may experience disruption to their education should any staff member choose to exercise their right to strike at the last minute.

We understand that this situation may be frustrating, and ask that all members of our school community continue to treat each other with respect. Bussage C of E Primary School remains committed to providing a safe and secure environment for our pupils and delivering high-quality teaching.

We are working closely with our staff to keep up to date with the situation, and we will inform you as soon as possible if arrangements change further.

#### Clerk to Governors vacancy:
